The landscapes and townscapes we inhabit are the result of a partnership between people and the land in which they have lived and laboured for more than 5,000 years. Every part of today's countryside has been shaped by history, and it's the endless interaction of people and nature that makes the landscapes of the North Wessex Downs Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty so special.

Rather than focus on particular archaeological sites or historic places,
Historic Landscape Characterisation encourages us to look at how they fit together as
parts of an intricately connected whole. By revealing the broad pattern of the landscape it
encourages us to explore the history and origins of our local woods, fields and settlements
with new eyes, prompting us to ask how they have come to be as they are today, what
stories they have to tell and why they matter for us and future generations.

The Sharing Historic Landscape Character project aims to bring together complex data about the history of our countryside and makes it accessible using the latest web mapping techniques. Following public feedback from workshops held in October 2015, we are developing an exciting new interactive web site that will be launched at the Heritage Forum.
