We have had a very busy month in the Parish, with lots of volunteers showing what a great community spirit we have in Chiseldon Parish. I hope some of the services mentioned below are of interest to you, or perhaps you may think about joining a new volunteer service?

PC Draper's report:

Crime statistics in the Parish continue to be low compared to previous years. There were some incidents of theft in January; these were mostly from Commercial premises.

Unfortunately criminal damage does appear to be slowly increasing. There have been reports of vehicles being damaged and number plates stolen off cars. Please carry on reporting any issues such as these as having them recorded on the Police National Computer can stop follow on crimes from occurring.

Non residential buildings do seem to be the target for theft so make sure your sheds, and outbuildings are securely locked with no items of value on show at the windows etc.

We are in the planning stages of having a Postbox installed for residents to use to communicate with the police over any concerns or queries. More information on this will follow in future editions.

Chiseldon Parish Neighbourhood Watch Scheme

The Chiseldon Parish Neighbourhood Watch Scheme held its most recent meeting on the 25th January and was once again well attended by local residents. PCSO Rob Dentry attended in his role as a member of the local Neighbourhood Policing Team. Concern was expressed in relation to the Anti-social Behaviour that had been evident over the Christmas and New Year period. PCSO Dentry acknowledged the problems and reassured members that certain young people had been spoken to in relation to their behaviour. The inappropriate use of motorcycles on the Recreation Ground and adjacent farmer's field had also led to the Police being involved with hopeful constructive outcomes which will see such activity cease. All Chiseldon residents are requested to report any suspicious activity or incident of anti social behaviour to the Police. If necessary, due to any activity being seen do call 999 otherwise call 101 and obtain a crime or log number.

The next Neighbourhood Watch meeting will take place on Monday 28th March commencing at 7.30pm at the Recreation Hall, accessed at the end of Norris Close.
