Police Report

Our police representatives have reported a lower level of crime over the last month, but some instances of thefts from gardens and properties remain – please be vigilant with your property as always and keep buildings and vehicles locked. This includes not leaving car keys visible at night, near your front door or near windows. Likewise please don't leave any bags or briefcases in your vehicle on view, even when locked. This applies to when at home or when parking in a public place.

Bus Services Consultation

Swindon Borough Council have held a consultation in regards to a reduction in the bus services we would see in Chiseldon Parish.

The Parish Council would like to know your views on what buses you use, what stops you get on and off at and how often you use them. As a result of the consultation it may be that Parish Councils across the County may have to consider funding a commercial mini bus service for residents use.

We would also like to thank local residents who organised a petition against the bus cuts. They managed to raise 800 signatures. This petition has been handed in to the Parish Council and Councillor David Hill has delivered it to Swindon Borough Council for consideration.

The X5 Salisbury Red's Service will stop visiting Chiseldon on Monday 5th September and will instead stop at the bus stop on the A346 Marlborough Road. The 8, 80, 70A and 72A and Sunday 5 services will continue to run as scheduled for the time being.

Placing stones and boulders on grass verges

The Parish Council have been made aware by Swindon Borough Council that any individual that places boulders, stones or other obstructions on to public grass verges to protect grass from being parked on is legally liable for any damage, injury or incident that occurs as a result of the obstruction placed there. This liability

also extends to the Parish Council should they wish to use this method of protecting the grass. We have therefore elected not to use this method to protect any grass verges and our advice to residents would be to remove any stones also to avoid liability. The council will post an information letter to this effect to any homeowner who is noted to be using boulders etc. This is to ensure homeowners are aware of all the facts as presented to us by Swindon Borough Council.

Library Consultations

Swindon Borough Council are having to reduce expenditure on libraries by around £1.5 million by 2020. They are having a consultation on a proposed strategy and proposal for the service moving forwards. They welcome everyone's views on the proposal. There are also a series of drop in events across the borough libraries for anyone who has any questions. A full listing can be obtained from the Parish Clerk. There is also a public meeting on September 6th 7-9pm at St Joseph's College on Ocotal Way.
