# Report for the period $1^{st} - 30^{th}$ January 2017

**06/01/17 – Windmill Piece – Criminal Damage** - unknown suspect has caused damage to a vehicle by removing and damaging the hub caps and scratching down one side.

**08/01/17 – Station Road – Dwelling burglary** - unknown suspect has attempted to break into the property by forcing the rear conservatory door. No entry gained.

**15/01/17 - Castleview Road - Criminal Damage** - report of suspect causing damage to telephone kiosk.

**17/01/17 – Butts Road – Criminal Damage** - vehicle parked at the location for three days. When they returned there was a note on windscreen asking them not to park it there and a deep scratch down the side of the vehicle with estimated damage to the value of £480. It is not possible to determine whether the two are related.

**21/07/17** – **Hodson Road - Road Traffic incident** – driver has driven into the rear of a parked vehicle causing damage.

**25/01/17 – Draycott Road – Dwelling burglary** - two males seen on CCTV to approach the property and attempt to gain entry. No entry gained to the property and no damage caused. Suspect arrested.

**28/01/17 – Norris Close – Dwelling burglary** - two males have entered the property via the rear door and have told the elderly resident that they are Police. They left when the victim started to shout for help.

#### BT Phone box consultation

We are currently working on getting the red phone box at Badbury adopted by the Parish Council so it can remain in place (but decommissioned) as part of the local scenery in Badbury.

We are also working with SBC to get the red phone box at Castle View Road retained as a red working phone box. We will be applying for listed status for this box.

All other phone boxes have had a recommendation put forward by SBC to have them removed.

## New Railings at the Chapel on Butts Road

Work will shortly be underway to install new iron railings at the Chapel on Butts Road. A trench needed to be dug to help with a damp issue inside the Chapel. Now this is resolved new iron railings that complement the existing railings are to be installed around the trench.

## Internal Alterations to the Chapel on Butts Road

In an effort to modernise the Chapel and make it a suitable working and meeting environment, work will begin shortly to install a new false ceiling with insulation, secondary glazing for the windows, decorating and new carpet. The Clerk's office may be closed for periods of time but this will be posted on our website, on the Community Facebook page and on the Chapel door.

# Extra Litter Picking

The Environment and Finance committees have approved the expenditure for extra litter picking each month across the parish. If you see an area that requires attention, please let the Clerk know.

## Extra Rubbish Bin

Plans are in place to put an extra rubbish bin on New Road in Chiseldon, at the bus stop next to the Service Station. Our hopes are that people will use the bin in this area instead of throwing their rubbish on the floor before they get on or off the bus.

## **Pavilion improvements**

Work has just finished at the sports pavilion used by the Chiseldon Football club to install new showers and cubicles, ensure a good supply of hot water and other necessary improvements. We hope this spurs the football club on to many more wins!

## **Recreation Hall Closure**

There is a plan in place to close the Recreation Hall for 2 weeks in April to continue the improvement works. We have hopefully scheduled this to not impact on any regular hall users, please contact the Clerk if this may affect you, or you need to enquire about a booking.
