Vacancy for a Parish Clerk

Due to a change in personal circumstances, the current Clerk will not be able to continue in the role beyond the end of this year. As a result, we are looking for a skilled administrator to support the work of the Council from January 2016 onwards.

The role is currently funded for 20 hours per week but this is under review. The Clerk opens the office for a number of set hours each week and will need to be available for between three and four evening meetings each month. The rest of the work can be done at home so the role is perfect for a parent with young children or someone recently retired.

Applicants will need to demonstrate attention to detail, strong organisational skills, experience of managing a budget and a flair for customer care. Chiseldon Firs

Swindon Borough Council recently opened the transit site for the travelling community that is located three miles South of Junction 15 on the Marlborough Road, known locally as Chiseldon Firs. This site is maintained for short-term use and there are currently three families in residence, who are due to move on in November.

Anyone applying to use Chiseldon Firs is required to sign a license agreement, pay a refundable deposit and undergo an ID check, and the site is visited several times a week by SBC officers. Police Report

PC Draper told this month's meeting that there were five reported crimes in the first half of October (three of which relate to either the garage or the Recreation Ground). These figures are broadly consistent with previous months.

There have been a number of issues with regard to motorcycles being used at the Recreation Ground but these have died down since three young people have been identified. PC Draper is currently working with the Youth Offending Team to determine the best course of action with regard to these offences.

PC Draper also addressed parking restrictions in the vicinity of Chiseldon School. He stated that the police are working in partnership with SBC inspectors to educate drivers as to the purpose of the restrictions and to enforce them more regularly. Finally, PC Draper told the meeting that speeding vehicles are now one of the top three priorities for the local policing team. There are particular problems along New Road and through Badbury and the Community Speedwatch effort has produced some very useful, if concerning, data. The issue of speeding farm vehicles was also raised and the police will liaise with local farmers on behalf of residents.

Highways

Inconsiderate parking continues to be an issue in the villages, particularly along bus routes and blocking drop kerbs. Buses need plenty of room and drop kerbs are there to help residents with mobility issues move freely around our community. Please consider other residents when choosing where to park.

Numerous potholes on the B4005 have been reported and holes on High Street and Mays Lane have also been added to the list, although there is no date for completion of this work as yet. The yellow lines in Turnball have been delayed due to illness within the team but they have now been re-marked and should be completed by the end of this month.

The Environment Committee is also looking for ways in which the junction of Turnball and Hodson Road can be made safer for drivers and pedestrians. One of the options being considered is the installation of a mirror. Swindon Borough Council does not support the installation of mirrors but they are used elsewhere, so the committee would appreciate the views of local residents to help it make the best decision for our particular needs.

Village appearance

Dog owners are reminded that the Council provides 14 bins for dog waste across the Parish. A map giving the various locations can be found on the Parish website. Developers are also being asked to look into the provision of extra bins at Badbury Park.

The old storage unit at Castle View/Downs View is due to be removed by the end of the year and a group of volunteers will shortly be installing two new benches – donated by local residents. One will be located in the Millennium Copse and the other alongside the Sir Henry Calley Memorial Gardens.

Badbury Park Community Association

The newly formed Badbury Park Community Association has held its first event, a very successful barbeque attended by some 80 residents. The Association has been invited to apply for a Jubilee Fund grant from the Parish Council and we look forward to more events very soon!
