

Rec Hall Improvement. Our long-term project to create a new Recreation Hall on the Recreation Field and create a better outside space for sports and leisure is making slow but steady progress. The current hall is well beyond its useful life expectancy, so the Parish Council recognised the need to improve the facilities. Draft 2 of stage 1 of the plans is to be approved shortly and we will then be submitting pre-planning forms to Swindon Borough Council. Our Recreation Ground Improvement Committee head this project. Agendas and minutes are found on our website.

Public Campaign for traffic lights on New Road/A346 Junction. Update from Cllr Lawrence Elliott (Chiseldon and Lawn Ward) at the November Full Council meeting. There was a meeting with head of Strategic Transport John Harris at Swindon Borough Council (SBC) where the A346/New Road issue was raised. There is a need to look at a holistic solution for the whole journey through Chiseldon to Wroughton. The route is still the diversion route from National Highways for when the M4 is closed. SBC are talking to National Highways about a solution. They may change this diversion route to go from Wroughton to Swindon and then down past the hospital. This work would take 12 months to make sure stakeholders were satisfied with the changes. The A346/New Road issue will be part of this solution.

Castleview Road Play Area. We have recently secured a long-term lease from Swindon Borough Council for the green area by the play park. This has enabled us to begin adding some new play equipment outside the fenced play area. The EGPA committee will be investigating options for MUGA goals and are considering this area for them to be sited. Skate Park Plans. We've obtained a couple of different skate park quotes and are planning to work with a grants company to try and maximise what we can have. The EGPA committee are considering the green

area by the play park on Castleview Road for the skate park to be sited, however we want to know what residents think about this location, particularly those who live in that area. We'll be doing an online survey (a link will be shared on our website, on our weekly enewsletter and on Facebook) so you can have your say. Paper surveys will be distributed to the houses around the site.

**Solar lamppost lighting on Strouds Hill carpark.** The planning committee have agreed to buy 2 solar lights and we are waiting for approval from Swindon Borough Council for the exact location of the lights prior to purchase and installation.

**Extension of washpool site lease.** Our current lease expires in 6 years (2028). The Council have approved an extension and we're talking to Burderop Estate to try and arrange it.

Neighbourhood Plan. A meeting was scheduled for Tuesday 6th December. The main agenda item was to review the 1st draft of the Plan and identify anything we wanted to change, or we felt was missing. In the last month we have completed a "Housing Needs Assessment", had a meeting with AECOM who will be producing the Design Codes document (standards for new builds in the village) and have started the process to pay for a study of the ecology in the parish, which can be added to the plan. 
Youth Provision. The council are in the early stages of investigating a provision for a youth service within the parish. We are exploring a number of avenues at the moment but as you can imagine, with the welfare and protection of children being involved, it could be a lengthy process. Notice of casual vacancy. Public notice is hereby given that a Build Out removal on New Road. Swindon Borough Council casual vacancy has occurred in the office of Councillor for the Parish Council following the resignation of Councillors Sanjay Dogra and Raj Patel on 10th November 2022. In accordance with Section 89(3) of the Local Government Act 1972, where the vacancy occurs within six months before the day on which the councillor whose office is vacant would regularly have retired, an election shall not be held under Section 89(1) of the above Act, and the vacancy will be filled at the next ordinary elections of councillors on 4th May 2023. The Council may choose to fill the vacancy for the period until that election. 11th November 2022.
