Avebury Manor Garden

The garden at Avebury Manor is arranged as a series of 'rooms', each with an individual style. Sit and relax in the quiet spaces. Completely accessible by wheelchair or mobility scooter.



Henge and stone circles

Why not take a guided tour around the largest prehistoric circle of standing stones in the world? An experienced guide will help bring the history of this ancient site to life.



Alexander Keiller Museum

One of the most important prehistoric archaeological collections in Britain is housed in the museum. Discover finds from the Avebury landscape spanning thousands of years, including a human skeleton from 5,300 years ago.
