Procurement Requirements

Note – this procurement procedure must adhere to S135 of the Local Government Act 1972 and the Public Contracts Regulations 2015. These are legal requirements. (See end of document)

All tenders must adhere to Chiseldon Parish Councils standing orders for contracts. Required by S135 of the 1972 Act

Date of tender:	19.6.25
Description/ Spec of Work required:	For the Parish of Chiseldon. Weed killing for all road edges and pavement edges where required. High strength weed killer to be provided. Relevant licences to use the products to be provided. Once a year. Road sweeper. To comprise of: Mini digger to first visit the parish to loosen and move all debris from road edges so that the sweeper is effective. Roads to be swept with machine Waste disposal to be included. A council site can be used for temporary placement of waste throughout the day to maximise sweeping time. All waste to be removed within 24 hours of completion of the job. Twice a year. A list of roads to be swept is at the end of this document. Sign washing. Jet wash road signs, street signs and other signs such as Neighbourhood Watch etc.

Once a year.

Specific cleaning of garage area off Castle View Road. Litter picking, hand removal/sweeping of debris. Graffiti removal Weed removal Other general tidying as required. Once a year.

Pavement sweeping. All pavements Once a year

A waste licence permit must be shown to council staff for your tender to be considered.


£10 million public liability insurance evidence must be shown to council staff for your tender to be considered.

Your prices should be guaranteed for 3 years.

The council reserve the right to terminate services with a 1 month notice period if work is not completed to standard. The council may hold a review of work before 3 years to ensure standards of work and cost effectiveness are satisfactory. The council offer this tender on a 3 year basis subject to standards of work being satisfactory.

A written contract will be drawn up and signed by both parties. The successful contract will be approved at the 21st July EGPA committee meeting with work expected to start immediately afterwards, subject to an annual schedule of work being approved by the Clerk to the council.

The council is a Living Wage employer and as such expects all contractors to pay its staff the Living Wage minimum. For 2025 this is £12.21 per hour.

- (3) Standing orders made by a local authority with respect to contracts for the supply of goods or materials or for the execution of works shall include provision for securing competition for such contracts and for regulating the manner in which tenders are invited, but may exempt from any such provision contracts for a price helow that specified in standing orders and may authorise the authority to exempt any contract from any such provision when the authority are satisfied that the exemption is justified by special circumstances.
- (4) A person entering into a contract with a local authority shall not be hound to inquire whether the standing orders of the authority which apply to the contract have been complied with, and non-compliance with such orders shall not invalidate any contract entered into by or on behalf of the authority.


